Our Goal

The Assembly Minority Conference knows that child care costs in New York State are untenable regardless of income level. Families of all demographics are struggling to find safe, reliable care on top of the climbing costs. Child care should not be equivalent to a second mortgage or more costly than college. Additionally, many families reside in child care deserts where lack of care results in loss of income.

Our Conference's approach is to increase access to care, remove the barriers to getting that care, while also helping working parents keep more of their hard-earned dollars.

State of Affairs



In New York, the annual cost of care for two children in a center is \$35,999, more than college tuition (\$8,579) and housing (\$29,292)

Least Affordable in the Nation As of 2023. New York State had the least affordable center-based school-aged care among all states and the District of Columbia


Child Care Deserts New York State has the "second highest amount of childcare shortages nationwide," as 64% of the State lacks regulated child care options
